FROM THE DEAN

The "Founding Fathers" of the American Guild of Organists were truly visionary when they listed education as a purpose for founding the guild. Education opportunities have been—and continue to be—a primary focus of AGO programming for more than a century, and the Omaha chapter of the AGO is no exception. In fact, the Omaha AGO chapter is recognized for development of education opportunities not only in our region, but nationally as well.

Consider the chapter's current programming: two upcoming workshops before the end of this season, including one titled "Basic Improvisation" (February 15); and "Service and Program Planning, Organization & Management" (April 25). Yet to come this season is the performance of the "B-Minor Mass" by Johann Sebastian Bach, (Friday, March 6), certainly a rare opportunity for musical growth, but for aesthetic, spiritual and artistic growth as well. Quoting from Spire Chamber Ensemble promotional material: "The B-minor Mass" is a pillar of human achievement on par with Michelangolo's "Sistine Chapel" and Shakespeare's collection of plays, and to witness it live is quite simply an essential life experience."

How about AGO certification opportunities offered by the Omaha chapter? Yes, our membership has at least one member preparing the take AAGO exams this spring in addition to one member who will finish Part II of the CAGO exam. Three members are preparing to play the SPC exam this spring. Moreover, National is developing a new certification program which "precedes" SPC. Omaha AGO is one of few chapters invited to serve as a "pilot project" chapter to "test run" examples of "what works and what needs to be changed." In its initial year of experimentation, this education opportunity may be either self-taught or taught as a class. This experimental education program will continue into the next season.

Omaha AGO has a significant history developing and supporting education events, not only at the local level, but the regional level as well. It has been noted that Omaha AGO membership lists 13 "Young Members," those members who are under the age of 30 years! Omaha

Choral works will include Magnificat and Nunc Dimittis by Michael McCabe and the premiere of an anthem by Marie Rubis Bauer. Marty Wheeler Burnett, Michael Bauer, and Laura Scow will play and conduct.

REVIEW

Suggestion of Three CDs to listen to. They have all been nominated for Grammys.

Jan Kraybill, *The Orchestral Organ*, Reference Recordings, ©2019.

This recording, played on the Julia Irene Kauffman Organ, Casavant Fréres, Op. 3875, at the Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts in Kansas City, MO, includes transcriptions of well-known and some obscure orchestral pieces, transcribed by organists, and in some occasions, the composer himself, including a world premiere and a first recording. Jan is only the third organist nominated for a Grammy, and the first woman organist nominated. This is an interesting recording involving transcriptions for organ of orchestral pieces.

Joyce DiDonato, Songplay, Erato, ©2019.

In this CD, Joyce improvises classical Italian vocal repertoire as well as contemporary selections. She is having fun with music and quotes Louis Armstrong, "You got to love to be able to play." As organists, we are encouraged to develop the skill of improvisation, so often used in previous centuries and by our French counterparts and making a comeback in our own time. *Songplay* is a fun example of a classical vocalist, having fun and improvising.

KC Chorale, Charles Bruffy, conductor, *Artifacts*. *The Music of Michael McGlynn*.

This recording explores the works of Irish composer Michael McGlynn (b. 1964). *Artifacts* is a remarkable collection of Chorale stalwarts and new favorites that deliver the movement and intimacy of a live performance. Recorded at the Cathedral of Saint Peter the Apostle in Kansas City, the album features elements of traditional Irish music, such as modal harmonies and ornamented melodies, as well as new compositions on ancient Irish texts. The Gaelic language and choral sounds are captivating and inspiring.
